


Learning Objectives

Attendees will identify strategies for connecting and collaborating with academic advising staff.

Advisors and librarians **work closely with students**, serving as **mentors and guides**. Advisors and librarians **connect students to valuable information critical to their success**.

How can librarians and advisors support each other?





Advisors to library: Refer students in upper-level or research-focused classes to their subject librarian. Share relevant library events and programs.

Librarians to advising: Use platforms like Personal Librarian or other engagement efforts to share advising information. Refer students with academic or career advising questions.

What leads to successful referrals?

Education: Once librarians and advisors understand when to direct students to one another, referral can become a regular component of student consultations.

Collaboration: When librarians and advisors frequently network and work together, trust is built that can facilitate increased referrals.

The following slides highlight this librarian's approach to education of and collaboration with advisors on the Miami University Oxford campus. **These successes can be replicated to facilitate library-advising partnerships on other college campuses**.




Online Training Module



The **Miami University Academic Support and Advising Association** (MUASAA) is "dedicated to supporting academic advisors at all university levels including faculty, professional staff advisors, academic support personnel, and other entities engaged in advising-related duties."

Librarian membership in MUASAA and Libraries participation in MUASAA-sponsored events has **increased advisor awareness of the role of librarians on campus**.



Librarian involvement in the annual MUASAA symposium has included:

- A 25-minute breakout session, "The University Library & Student Success: What's the Connection," accepted and presented @ 2018 event
- A keynote by the Dean and University Librarian @ 2020 event
- Librarian membership on 2019-20 symposium planning committee and co-chair appointment for 2020-21 committee

Advisor Campus Org

Librarian participation in MUASAA service projects has led to **increased visibility of librarians on campus**. Service projects have included:

- "MUASAA Gives Back"
 - Handwritten holiday cards to student veterans
- "Midterm Motivation"
 - Handed out pens and printed words of encouragement in student center
- Food Drive
 - Collected personal and food items from students moving out of dorms during finals week

Workshop Series



Student Success Librarians and College of Arts and Sciences advisors partnered to offer a **workshop series** targeting **undecided students**.

Librarians attended advisor-led workshops as a resource for students and Student Success Librarian for Foundational Learning additionally developed a libraries-led workshop in the series.

Libraries-led workshop was hands-on and informal, and **focused on resources useful for researching companies**, such as:
