









- 574 federally recognized tribes
- 169 Native North American languages
- Less than 20 have more than 2,000 at-home speakers
- 1 in 5 at-home speakers are 65+
- 1 in 10 at-home speakers are between 5 and 17

What can we do?

- Land acknowledgements
- LibGuides or other research tools
- Incorporate indigenous knowledge into instruction
- Cultivate student researchers
- Make ILR a priority
- Codify ILR-related collections policies
- Secure ILR-related grants and programs
- Forge relationships with tribes
